Mary DeJoseph, D.O.

Mary DeJoseph, D.O. works with the New Jersey/Northeast Fetal Alcohol Spectrum Disorder Education and Research Center and is an adjunct faculty member at the Philadelphia College of Osteopathic Medicine. She is licensed in Family Medicine in Pennsylvania with clinical practice experience in General Practice and Geriatrics. She serves on the New Jersey and Philadelphia Task Forces on Fetal Alcohol Spectrum Disorders (FASD) and served on the National Fetal Alcohol Syndrome/Fetal Alcohol Effects Task Force. She is a listed author on the Center for Disease Control and National Task Force publication "Preventing Alcohol Exposed Pregnancies" and has authored two chapters in "Prenatal Alcohol Use and FASD: Diagnosis, Assessment, and New Directions in Research and Multi-modal Treatment." She consults with the Mental Health Association in New Jersey and does workshops on a variety of addiction and mental health topics. She is currently on the Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration's (SAMHSA) FASD Center for Excellence Expert Panel and the New Jersey Governor's Council for the Prevention of Developmental Disabilities. Dr. DeJoseph recently received an Ambassador Award in the area of Health Care from the New Jersey Governor's Council on Mental Health Stigma. Dr. DeJoseph is a member and regional coordinator in the SAMHSA Birth Mother's Network.



Susan M. Smith, Ph.D.

Susan M. Smith, Ph.D., is Professor of Nutritional Sciences at the University of Wisconsin-Madison. Her research laboratory investigates how prenatal alcohol exposure produces the facial characteristics that are distinctive of Fetal Alcohol Syndrome, and that work has been continuously supported by the National Institute on Alcohol Abuse and Alcoholism (NIAAA) since 1995. More recently, her research has expanded to investigate genetic and nutritional modifiers of FASD outcome and recently identified maternal iron status as one such potent modifier. She serves on numerous review panels for NIAAA and other agencies and chaired the Neurotoxicity and Alcohol study section for the National Institute of Health (NIH). Dr. Smith is the recipient of several honors and awards including a ten-year Method to Extend Research in Time (MERT) Award from NIAAA, and she was President of the FASD Study Group, a consortium of FASD investigators, in 2010-2011. She has numerous peer-reviewed publications in the areas of FASD and developmental toxicology. She received her B.S. from Purdue University, Ph.D. from UW-Madison and postdoctoral training at Harvard Medical School before joining the Madison faculty in 1990.
